Middle Years Program Admissions

All students who begin Académie Lafayette's Middle Years Program in grade 6 have been a part of our French immersion K-5 program at either our Cherry Campus or Oak Campus. All students automatically participate in our French immersion MYP that spans from grades 6 through 8. In grade 6, students select either Mandarin or Spanish to begin study of a new language to prepare for Group 2 in the Diploma Program.

All families are encouraged to attend our open house presentations about the MYP in the fall of each school and as needed throughout the year. These presentations will include information regarding the Diploma Programme so families and students can plan ahead.

Many students from our middle school select Académie Lafayette International High School as their high school of choice when they enter grade 9. These students continue their MYP journey by continuing Language and Literature courses in both English and French. All students from Académie Lafayette Middle School are also required to continue their language acquisition study in either Mandarin or Spanish. This is continued through grade 10 when the MYP is completed.

ALIHS also has a lottery system in place to allow for new students to join the high school in grade 9. ALIHS allows new enrollment seats for approximately 20% of the continued enrollment from Académie Lafayette Middle School. These students begin their language acquisition study of French in grade 9 and continue in grade 10.

All students of ALIHS complete all MYP courses in grades 9 and 10 and complete the Personal Project in grade 10.

Diploma Programme Admissions

The IB Diploma Programme will offer students many opportunities for personal development, academic study and research, the development of leadership and collaborative skills, and a chance to contribute to the wider community, which is managed through the CAS framework (Creativity, Activity, Service).

All ALIHS students will have the opportunity to participate in the Diploma Programme if prerequisites for applicable classes are met. The following prerequisites will be required:

The intent of this commitment is to maximize each student's potential for success while attending ALIHS.

Académie Lafayette International High School recognizes the value of student participation in rigorous and engaging coursework and encourages students to graduate having completed the International Baccalaureate MYP, earned a high school diploma from the state of Missouri, and potentially receive IB Diploma course Certificates, IB Bilingual Diploma, or IB Diploma.

Research has found that students who participate in IB courses are more likely to be ready for college coursework after high school graduation and complete a bachelor's degree in college. Your commitment to your courses at ALIHS will help support your career and college choices as a young adult.

Armour Campus Commitment --ALIHS commits to rigorous coursework by:

- Communicating the value of the IB programmes and coursework.
- Encouraging students to enroll and complete at least one IB DP course in 11th-12th grade.
- Supporting students through on-going Academic Extension, Advisory, and outside school support opportunities to meet individual student needs.
- Providing students with extracurricular and service learning activities throughout each academic year.

Teacher Commitment:

Our IB teachers commit to encouraging student participation and success, planning for student learning, providing rigorous, quality instruction, and offering assistance for struggling students.

- Teach the course following the curriculum developed by ALIHS and as authorized by the International Baccalaureate Organization.
- Provide instruction that prepares students for the next level academic course, and be both meaningful and relevant to the required learning goals.

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- Provide Approaches To Learning (ATL) skills to help students be successful in all courses.
- Understand that workload for my courses will be reasonable for the course requirements and scope of students' other class commitments.
- Provide opportunities for students to be successful to include appropriate tutorial opportunities for students who have difficulty with course content or necessary skills for my course.
- Monitor student progress in my course and assign outside of school support sessions when a student falls behind as outlined in the student handbook.

IB courses are challenging and initial grades may not reflect later performance. Therefore, I will make a commitment to my success by adjusting to the high expectations that will best prepare me for success.

 - Collaborating with peers when appropriate to develop a deeper knowledge of the content.
