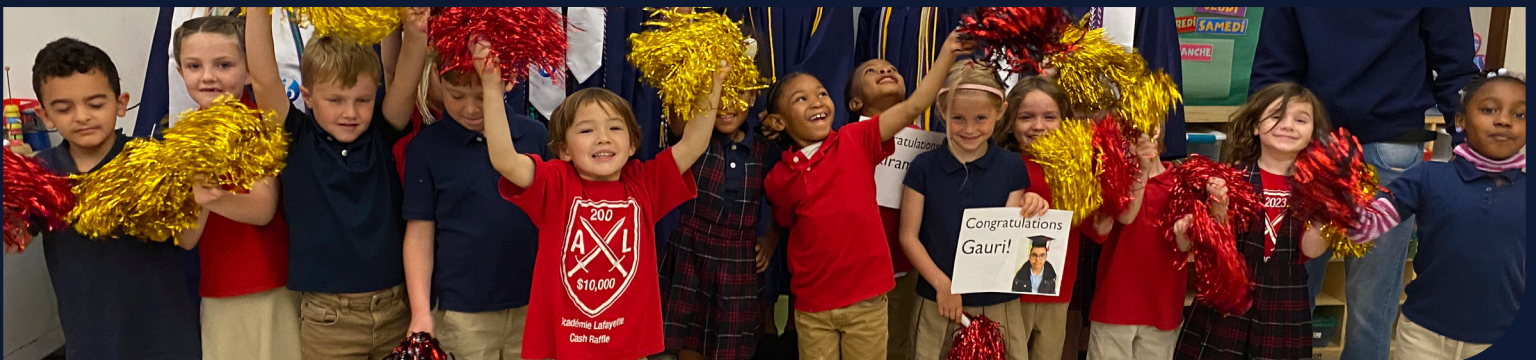

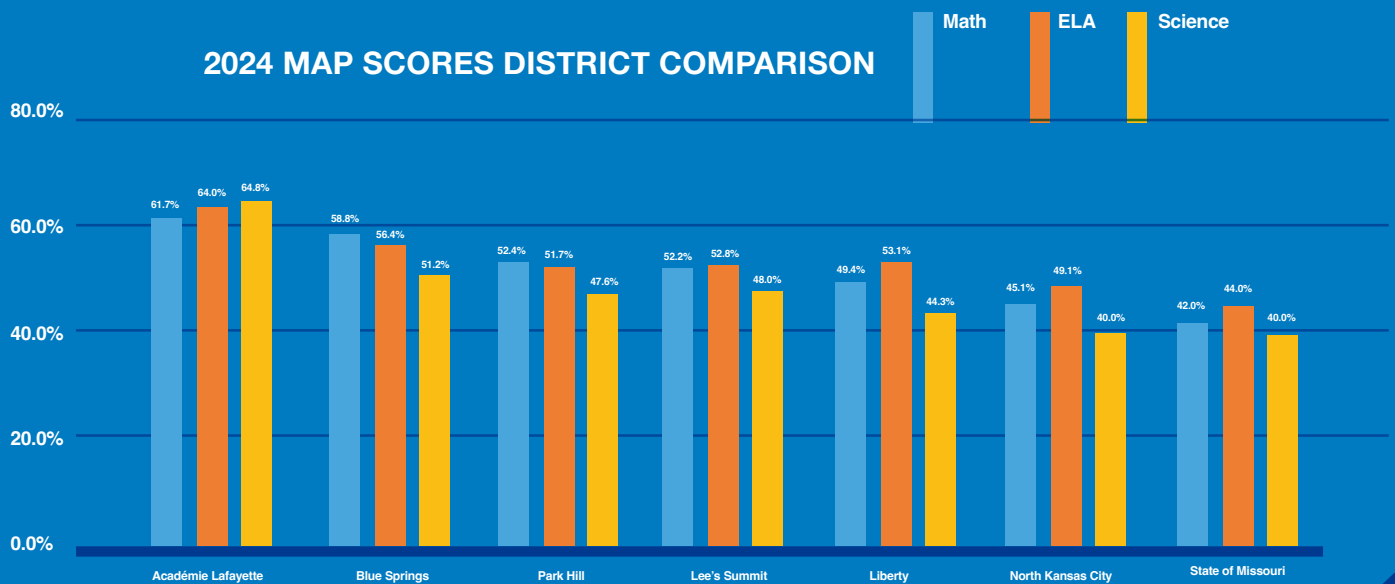




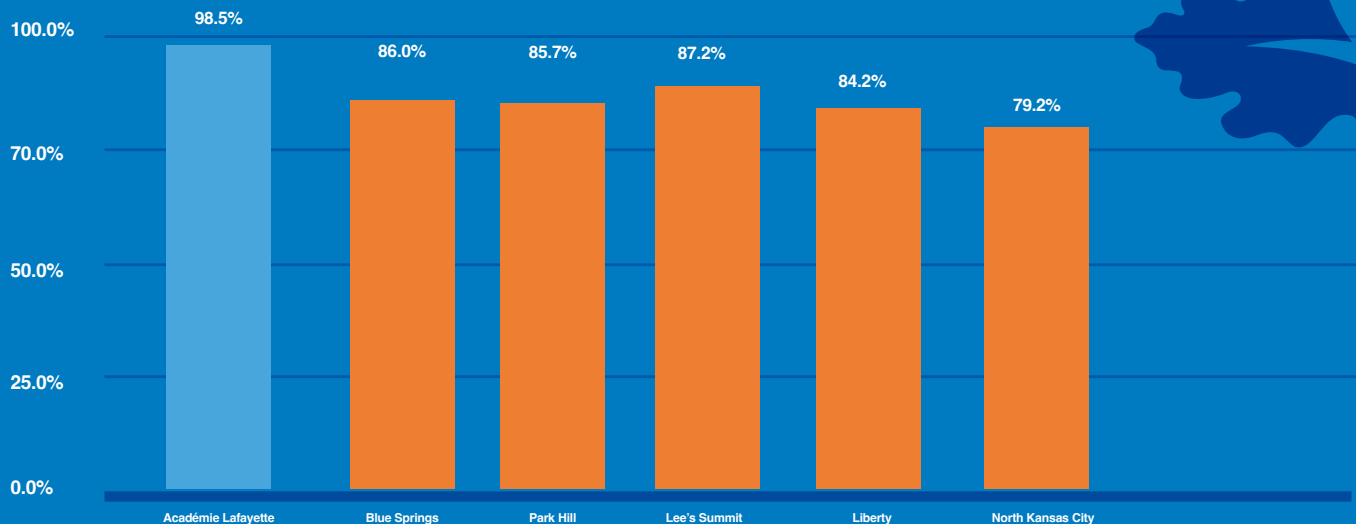
Academic Achievement

State & Local: \$18,086,039 = 83.0%

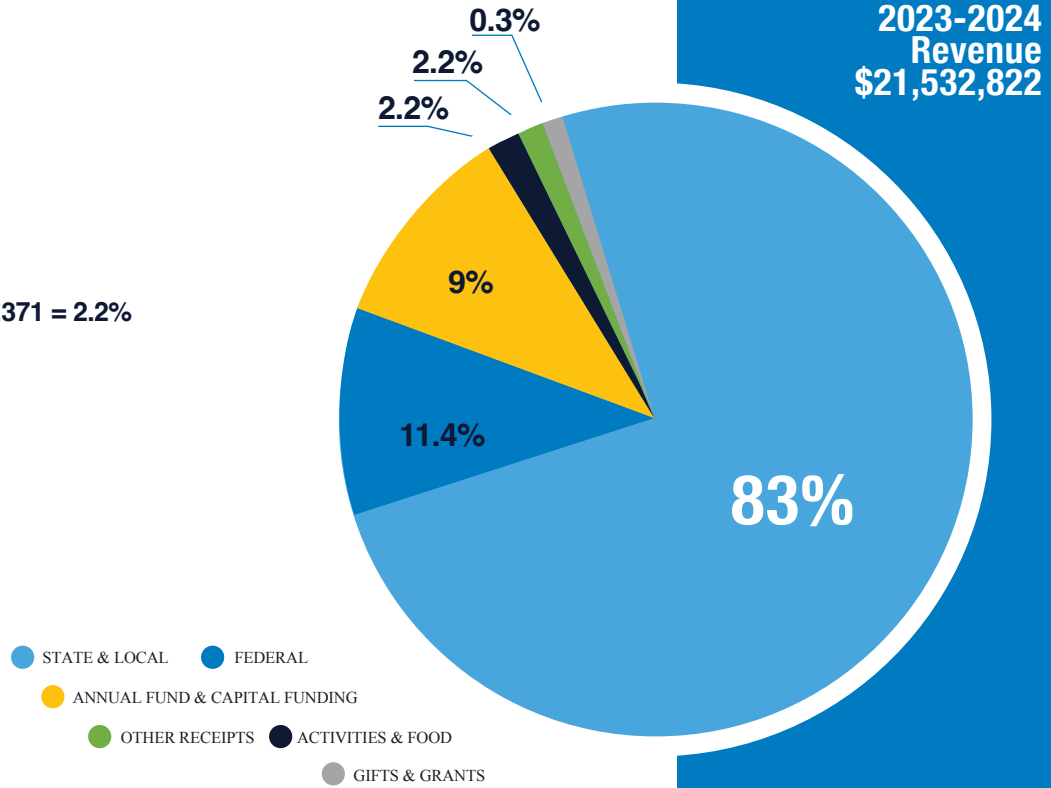
Federal: \$2,486,973 = 11.4%

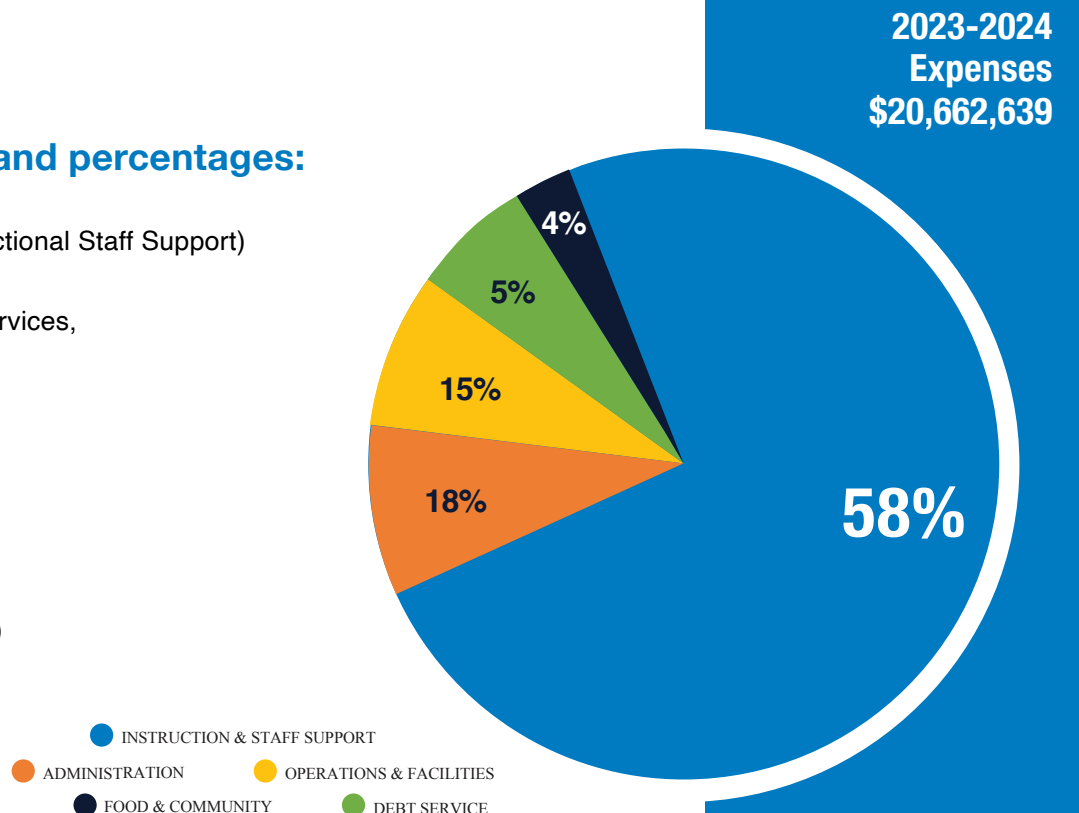
